

How to Use Naloxone

Naloxone is a medicine for the treatment of a known or suspected opioid overdose or fentanyl poisoning.

Symptoms

- Pale face
- Limp body
- Blueish lips or nails
- Vomiting or gurgling
- Drowsiness or unconsciousness
- Slow breathing or heartbeat
- Muscle spasms

Naloxone is safe and easy to use. Follow these three simple steps:



Peel — Peel the package. Do not push the plunger.



Place — Place in one of the person's nostrils.



Press — Press down on the plunger.

Remember — Call **9-1-1** after you give naloxone. An overdose requires emergency medical attention even after naloxone is used!

Naloxone FAQ

What is naloxone?

Naloxone is a nasal spray medicine for the treatment of a known or suspected overdose. Naloxone is the name of the generic drug. Brand names include Kloxxado and Narcan.

Do I still need to call emergency services if I use naloxone?

Yes, naloxone is not a substitute for emergency services needed during a known or suspected opioid overdose or fentanyl poisoning. Call **9-1-1** after you give naloxone.

Who can use naloxone?

Anyone can use naloxone. There is no special training required. One spray contains a single dose.

Can I use naloxone on a child?

Yes, naloxone is safe for children.

Can I reuse naloxone?

No, you cannot reuse naloxone. Each device is for a single use and single dose. The device is to be sprayed once and then thrown out.

Where can I get naloxone?

CalOptima Health is offering free naloxone to all members. If you are not a member, you can purchase naloxone at a pharmacy without a prescription or get a free dose from an Orange County Health Care Agency provider partner. Visit www.fentanylisforeveroc.org.
